A Black History Month Celebration!

"My Lord, What A Morning": African American Music Gala 2016

"My Lord, What A Morning" is the uplifting title of Houston Ebony Opera Guild Chorus's upcoming Annual African American Music Gala: A Concert of Works by Black Composers. In a program featuring arrangements of Spirituals and original compositions by several African American classical composers, the Guild's chorus and soloists will perform under the baton of Roland M. Carter who is returning as guest conductor.

CONCERT HIGHLIGHTS:

Among the concert's major highlights will be "I Will Lift Up Mine Eyes," **Adolphus Hailstork**'s famed cantata for chorus and tenor soloist, and selections by **Harry T. Burleigh**, the trailblazing Black composer born in 1866—in the immediate aftermath of slavery. Music by Robert L. Morris, Edward Margetson, and Robert A. Henry, founder of Houston Ebony Opera Guild, will also be performed.

CONTEXT AND SIGNIFICANCE:

This concert will add the music of African American classical musicians (composers, singers, conductors, and instrumentalists) to Houston's celebration of Black History Month. In particular, the program will celebrate these significant birth anniversaries:

- sesquicentennial of Harry T. Burleigh (1866 -1949), a pioneering African American classical composer and arranger (beginning in the late 19th century); the first black composer to be instrumental in the development of characteristically American music;
- **centennial of Robert A. Henry** (1916-1996), **founder of Houston Ebony Opera Guild,** choral conductor, pianist, composer, and expert in vocal pedagogy;
- **75th jubilee of Adolphus Hailstork** (b. 1941), an African American who is one of today's leading American composers, and whose works blend ideas from both the African American and European traditions;
- **75th jubilee of Robert L. Morris** (b. 1941), founding artistic director of the Leigh Morris Chorale, noted accompanist, and a composer hailed as influential in the field of African American music.
